Kennedy received a Ph.D. in sociology from the University of North Carolina. Formerly, he taught at the University of Michigan. His current research focuses on the cultural articulation of democracy, peace, and energy security in Europe and Eurasia. He is author, among other works, of *Cultural Formations of Post communism: Emancipation, Transition, Nation, and War* (University of Minnesota Press, 2002), and *Professionals, Power and Solidarity in Poland* (Cambridge University Press, 1991). Polish President Aleksander Kwasniewski presented Kennedy with the Gold Cross of Merit to recognize his contributions to scholarship and education about Poland.
