



CampusFrance – What is CampusFrance?


- ♦ In 1998 the French government created CampusFrance, an agency dedicated to international mobility in higher education and research.
- CampusFrance aims to :
 - Promote French Higher education programs throughout the world
 - ◆ Offer international students a path to succes via higher education in France by assisting students with their first enquiries made in their home countries to their actual stay in France and ending with their return home.



CampusFrance – What is CampusFrance?

CampusFrance in figures

- 150 overseas offices in 97 countries employing approximately 300 people
- 60 million pages consulted on CampusFrance websites
- ♦ 36,000 **study programs** in an online search engine
- Almost 600 grant and scholarship programs accessible using the CampusBourses search engine
- 25 major events each year that attract 200,000 visitors and the participation of 600 institutions
- In some 30 countries, an online application system facilitates the **visa request process**









5 Arguments for France

♦ 1 / Quality of Life





According to the International living association,

France has been world leader for quality of life for the past 5 years!

- **First** tourism destination in the world!
- ◆ The freeway system is the **most developed** in the world
- Eurostar, Thalys and Lyria high-speed trains are directly connected to major European cities (London, Amsterdam, Geneva etc.)
- ◆ A **renowned and diversified gastronomy** classified since 2010 as Intangible Cultural Heritage by the UNESCO (over 350 cheese types, renowned vineyards, etc.)
- Diversified cultures and landscapes (mountains, urban areas, sea, ocean and countryside)
- ◆ An exceptional influence from History, Culture and Arts

2 / Modern French Culture



France is definitely the product of the times with its contemporary artists:

- ◆ France excels in **electronic music**. Since the 80's with Jean-Michel Jarre, the « **French touch** » is renowned worldwide. (David Guetta, Daft Punk, Justice, Bob Sinclar...)
- ◆ Every year many **music festivals** (Les vieilles charrues, les Francofolies, Jazz in Marciac...), as well as **theatre festivals** (Avignon) or photo festivals (Arles) are organised in France.
- ◆ France's cinema tradition goes back to the creation of this art in 1895 by the Lumière brothers. The annual **Cannes festival** is a major event for all cinema professionals.
- ◆ Many **major architects** are French: Gustave Eiffel (Eiffel Tower, Statue of Liberty), Le Corbusier, Jean Nouvel (Louvre Abu-Dhabi, Quai Branly museum), Philippe Starck are among the most famous designers of our time.

5 Arguments for France

◆ 3 / Learning an international language: French



More than 200 million people worldwide speak French.

- The French language is firmly established in Africa, the Antilles, Louisiana, Lebanon and South-East Asia.
- ◆ About 9.6 million Canadians speak French, mainly in Québec.
- ◆ Individually or with other languages, French is an **official language in 32 States**.
- ◆ Together with English, French is one of the only two languages spoken on the five continents. It is an official language in the UNO, UNESCO, OECD and International Olympic Committee.
- ◆ About 83 million people learn French. It is the most taught language after English









5 Arguments for France

◆ 4 / High-quality tertiary education



France's tertiary education and university tradition is several centuries old.

- France sums up 83 universities, 205 engineering schools and 220 business and management schools, 120 art schools and 20 architecture schools.
- ◆ According to the Financial Times, 5 French institutions are in the **top 10** of the best management Master in the world. France has also 6 of the best MBA's in the world.
- France carries out an **equality of treatment policy** and **Registration fees** are the same for all students (national and international) and All students have the same rights (healthcare rights, discounts, housing aid).
- ◆ France is ranked 3rd in the list of host countries for foreign students. Now, the foreign student population represents about 12% of the global student population.


5 Arguments for France

♦ 5 / Degrees recognised in Europe and worldwide



The Bologna process has created a unified tertiary education area, which enables bridges to other tertiary education systems in the world.

- ◆ Thanks to the LMD system (Licence, Master, Doctorat, i.e. Bachelor's, Master's and Doctorate), a better understanding of European diplomas makes academic exchanges easier and promotes international mobility.
- ◆ International accreditations assess the quality of formations (AACSB, EQUIS, AMBA....)
- Renowned institutions are settled in every continent
 - École Centrale in Beijing (China)
 - La Sorbonne in Abu Dhabi (United Arab Emirates)
 - Skema Business School in Raleigh (US) and Suzhou (China)
- ♦ With a French degree, international careers are possible !!



Completion of secondary school + Baccalauréat or equivalent (eligibility to enter higher education in home country) = access to French higher education






CampusFrance – How much doest it Cost...?



CampusFrance – French higher education

The LMD systeme

French higher education is divided into 3 "cycles" in accordance with the common **European system (LMD)**:

- **L**icence (Bachelor's)
- **M**aster's
- Doctorat(e)

ECTS, the European Credit Transfer System, is a system of cumulable and transferable educational units that **attest** to the successful completion of periods of education.

The number of semesters of postsecondary study and their equivalent in ECTS are counted toward the award of degrees:

- ◆ Licence (L) = 6 semesters = 180 ECTS credits
- Master (M) = 4 semesters = 120 ECTS credits
- ◆ Doctorat (D) = minimum of 3 years after the Master (not expressed in ECTS credits)













CampusFrance Website – The first step to reach France

♦ Search engines and databases for French Program

Using data from Onisep and the Ministry of Higher Education and Research,

CampusFrance develops search engines that make it easy to find detailed information on any higher education program in France:

- The comprehensive catalog of French postsecondary programs, updated regularly, provides details on 36,000 programs in three languages: French, English, and Spanish
- CampusFrance offers an online catalog of 292 doctoral programs that can be searched using 20,000 key words or by 80 disciplinary specializations. Results include affiliated laboratories and program profiles in French and English
- CampusFrance's catalog of programs taught in English contains information on some 600 programs from the Licence to the Doctoral level





CampusFrance Website – The first step to reach France

♦ A searchable database of grants and scholarships

CampusFrance offers a directory of 600 grants programs.

Published in French and English, the CampusBourses search engine allows users to find information on grants for study, research, internships or travel.

- Grants are available from a variety of sources:
 - French Governemental and International Institutions
 - ◆ The European Union
 - Local Government Organisations
 - Corporations
 - Foundations
 - Higher education Institutions




CampusFrance – Studying art and Desing in France

CampusArt is an online system that allows prospective students to apply simultaneously to 60 carefully selected French schools of art and applied arts. The CampusArt network offers a choice of some 200 art programs at the Licence and Master's levels.



 France's long tradition of excellence and innovation in art, design and architecture makes it an ideal place to start or advance a career in these exciting fields.





Campus France – How to get your Visa for Studies in France?

Study Abroad or Exchange Students

♦ You must do this before you apply for a visa !!!

If you are going to study at a higher education institution in France through a study-abroad or exchange program, and/or you are planning to transfer credit for your coursework in France back to your U.S. institution, please complete the CampusFrance online process.

- ◆ 1/ Create your PASTEL account on the CampusFrance USA website.
 - ◆ Go to www.usa.campusfrance.org
 - ♦ Make sure you check the video guide or Study Abroad User Guide PDF to help you fill out this section
- ◆ 2/ Use your email address and password to log in to your CampusFrance account and complete the CampusFrance form using the PASTEL system.
 - Your CampusFrance form has to be officially submitted online through PASTEL in order for your file to be processed. <u>Don't forget to validate your form!</u>
- ◆ 3 / Send via postal mail a copy of your acceptance letter from your American university's program or the French university that you will be attending, along with your CampusFrance processing fee in the form of a money order.
- ◆ 4/ Regularly check your CampusFrance inbox through PASTEL for your confirmation email and proof of payment.

 Print copies for submission to the French consulate.
- ◆ 5/ Request a student visa at the at the Consulate General of France in Miami.



Campus France – How to request a student visa for France?

Long stay visa for studies

How to apply for a long stay student visa ?

All applicants for a student visa must first register with CampusFrance!

- ◆ 1/ Register and obtain an attestation from CampusFrance, prior to applying for a visa at the Consulate General of France in Miami.
- 2/ Once you complied with CampusFrance requirements, please make an appointment.
 - For security reasons, all applicants have to appear personally at the Consulate General of France in Miami.
 - To schedule an appointment, you must go on <u>www.consulfrance-miami.org</u>
 - No appointment can be made by phone or by e-mailing us
- 3 / Processing time: It may take about 21 days for US Citizens.
- ◆ 4/ Requirements: Please provide the original + copies of each document. The visa section does not make any copies, you must bring your documents and the required number of copies.
 - ♦ Original passport + Processing fee + One application form + One ID picture + proof of residence...
- 5/ Important information
 - The consular administration has full authority to evaluate and request more documents than those submitted by the applicant.
 - Please be aware that submitting the aforementioned documents does not guarantee the approval of the visa.
 - Please be aware that the visa application process (between CampusFrance and the Consulate) can take up to 4 weeks.
