Beverly Crawford is Professor of Political Science and Political Economy and the Co-Director of the European Union Center at the University of California, Berkeley. She has published extensively and is an internationally known speaker on topics such as European politics, German foreign policy, technology transfer policy, post-communist transitions, the European Union, the Euro-Med process, globalization, and ethnic conflict. She is the author of *Economic Vulnerability in International Relations*, and *Power and German Foreign Policy: Embedded Hegemony in Europe*, a seminal study of Germany's role in constructing the European Monetary Union, European diplomacy, and non-proliferation policy. She is co-editor of several volumes on Europe and the European Union.



Jeff Pennington is Co-director of the European Union Center and Executive Director of the Institute of Slavic, East European, and Eurasian Studies at the University of California, Berkeley. He holds a BS in Foreign Service from the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University, and MA in East European Studies from Indiana University, and has conducted doctoral work at the Graduate School of International Cooperation Studies at Kobe University in Japan. His studies and work have allowed him to live for extended periods of time in a number of countries, including Hungary, Romania, and Japan. His research interests include 19th- and 20th-century Hungarian and Romanian history, and particularly the history and ethnography of Transylvania. He is currently working on a project to compare the diplomatic relations Japan

had with both Romania and Hungary during the interwar period.
