Dr. Marija Brujić (née Krstić) is a research associate in socio-cultural anthropology at the University of Belgrade in Serbia. From 2014 she teaches a PhD course, "Anthropology of Migration" at the University of Belgrade.

She received her BA, MA and PhD from the University of Belgrade. In 2013, she defended her PhD thesis "Europeanisation of Serbia at the beginning of the 21st century. Anthropological analysis of socio-cultural changes during Euro-integrations". In addition to this, she finished her M.Sc. studies in visual anthropology at the University of Oxford (2009/10). She was also a visiting student at the Comenius University in Bratislava, Slovakia (2008) and a visiting scholar at the Karl Franzens University in Graz, Austria (2013).

Beside her mother tongue (Serbian), Dr. Brujić is fluent in English and speaks German and Slovak. Her scope of professional interest include anthropology of the EU, anthropology of migrations, visual anthropology, globalization, culture and identity politics, and methodology of anthropology. She is currently writing a book (in Serbian) on cultural representations of the EU and EU-integration of Serbia among members of Serbian Diaspora in Austria.
