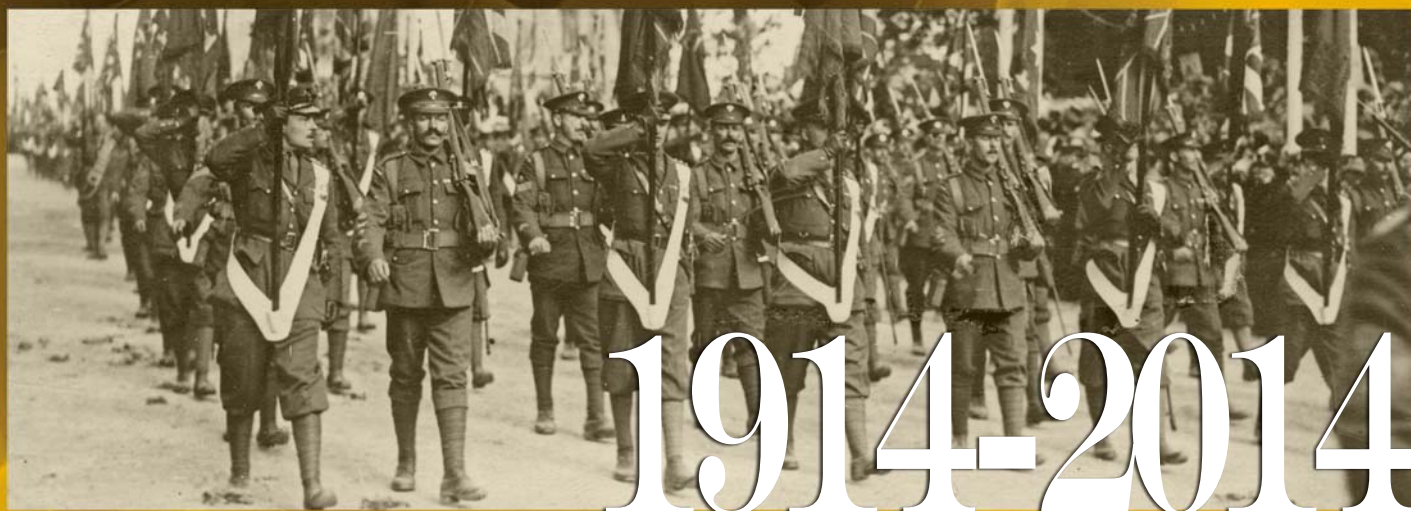

World War I Commemoration – One Hundred Years After –

Join the School of International and Public Affairs for a series of events commemorating the centennial anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War. In the summer of 1914, the war that ensued in the aftermath of the assassination of the heir to the Austro-Hungarian Empire became one of the deadliest conflicts in human history. The First World War saw the collapse of three empires and paved the way for protracted instability among many of the nations involved. We commemorate the Great War, not only because of the tragic loss of life that the conflict wrought, but to understand why the world still lives in the shadow of that conflict. Many of the global issues that we face today descend from the world of 1914. These events will highlight the issues that led to conflict and the legacy of the “war to end all wars.”
