Timothy Snyder is professor of history at Yale University, specializing in the political history of central and eastern Europe. He received his doctorate from the University of Oxford, where he was a British Marshall Scholar. He has also held fellowships in Paris, Warsaw and at Harvard, where he was an Academy Scholar. A frequent guest at the Institute for Human Sciences in Vienna, he has spent ten years there and elsewhere in Europe. His most recent books include *The Red Prince: The Secret Lives of a Habsburg Archduke* (2008); and *Bloodlands: Europe Between Hitler and Stalin* (2010).
